Problem Again Arises At Meeting of Local Hospital Board

in view of the present outbreak of scarlet fever here, was up for discussion at last night's meeting of the hospital board, the old question of responsibility for the operation of the decrepit and poorly equipped quarters being once again cone into. The outcome of the discussion was the passage of a motion, proposed by F. A. MacCalform and seconded by W. M. Brown, that the hospital board does not ssume any financial responsibility n connection with the establish-

The questiion came up in connection with the reading of correspondence between the hospital and the provincial secretary on the subject. The isolation hospital, it appears, was opened up to receive as a patient a man who had been member of the crew of the steamer Princess Louise. Under these circumstances, some question has arisen as to just where the responsibility rests for the paying of the operation of the isolation The city commissioner ere has refused to pay, so has the city of Victoria where the paient comes from. Correspondence from the provincial secretary fails to fix the responsibility but gives assurance that, somehow or other. the cost will be taken care of. Meantime, it was reported to the board that the medical health officer here had made personal cash advances in connection with the payment of special nurses who had been brought here to staff the isolation hospital.

These nurses were engaged by Miss Jean Harrison R. N., lady operintendent of the Prince Ruil of the responsibility of anyhe isolation hospital, told of dedorable conditions existing at the isolation hospital. .
