Air Estimates for Next Year Almost Doubled by British Government

LONDON, Nov. 15: (CP)—The British government will increase air estimates next year from £120,000,000 to £200,000,000, Sir Kingsley Wood announced in the House of Commons.

REVENUE ESTIMATE

VICTORIA, Nov. 15: (CP)—In his estimates for the coming year, presented to Legislature last week, Hon. John Hart, minister of finance, anticipated increased revenues out of game licences, liquor sales, motor vehicle licences, land registry fees, timber licences, timber sales and water rentals.

Decreased revenue is expected from fuel oil tax collections, income tax, investment interest, mineral taxes and timber royalties.

The estimates provide increased appropriations for school buildings, rural school district advances, government agents, old age pensions and forest protection.

An item of \$28,000 is allowed for reforestation and \$20,000 for the university.

FEMINE INVASION


