## INNOCENCE

Former Assistant Russian Commissar Denies Spying But Recants

MOSCOW, March 3: (CP)-N. N. Krestinsky, former assistant commissar of foreign affairs and one time Soviet ambassador to Germany, desperately protested his innocence yesterday of spying on behalf of Germany, Japan, England and Poland at the opening of the trial on treason charges of twentyone fallen Soviet leaders. The state produced alleged confessions of his twenty co-defendants. Krestinsky repudiated a confession attributed to him, declaring it had been wrung from him under duress while he was in prison. He recanted today, however, and pleaded completely guilty as Moscow's greatest treason trial proceeded Imposition of death sentences on Krestinsky and the twenty codefendants are anticipated.

At Fresno downtown streets were rendered impassable last night by flood waters. Foundations of buildings were endangered and bridges were torn loose as the Fresno and San Joquin Rivers continued to

The possibility was seen today that more than fifty persons may have lost their lives in the floodfour-day storm which was climaxed by yesterday's deluge. The exact number of dead will probably never be known.
