Hitler Wins

LONDON, Feb. 16: (CP)-Chancellor Hitler wins! Austria's independence is doomed!

In his Reichstag speech next Sunday Hitler, it is expected here, will again proclaim belief in Austrian independence.

But neither in London nor Paris is there any illusion as to the real meaning of Austria's cabinet shuffle. It will be independence in name only. Germany will pull the

strings. Meanwhile in Vienna, according to reports reaching here, more than two thousand amnestied Nazi political prisoners have begun leaving Austrian penitentiaries and concentration camps as the reorgan-

ized cabinet assumes full control. The first Austrian reaction varied from dismay among the Jews to jubilation among the Nazis who felt that they would be members of an illegal party little longer. Cath-

olics are apprehensive. Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden strongly intimated to an anxious parliament that, without Italian support for protection of Austria's independence, Great Britain would adopt a hands off policy.

## MAY VOTE IN SPRING

Dewdney By-Election Will Not Be Held Until After Middle Of May-Who Will Be New Leader?

VICTORIA. Feb. 16: (CP)-The provincial by-election to fill the vacancy in the Legislature for Dewdney seat caused by the death of Dr. F. P. Patterson, Leader of the Opposition, will be held "some time after the middle of May." Premier T. D. Pattullo said yester-

Meantime there is political speculation as to who will succeed Dr. Patterson as Leader of the Opposition. Herbert Anscomb, member for Victoria and chief financial critic of the government, and Hon, R. L. Maitland K. C., one of the 'Vancouver members and a former cabinet minister, are an ong those prominently mentioned. A Conservative party convention will have to be held but this is not likely to take place until after the Dewdney by-election, the result of which would have a bearing on the relative strength of the Conservative and C. C. F. groups in the House, thereby affecting the right to name the leader of the Opposition.
