#### FIRST PORT DAY

Tomorrow is Prince Rupert's first Port Day and in this number we have tried to assemble as briefly as possible a number of facts about the port that should prove of interest especially to outside people who wish information in regard to the city.

If Port Day tomorrow is a success it will probably become an annual event. If it is not a success, some other kind of annual celebration will have to be devised. Much enthusiasm is being shown for tomorrow's event and, doubtless, it will be an outstanding celebration.

#### MAKING RUPERT LINE PAY

We are all glad to hear President Hungreford of the Canadian National Railways say he is anxious to make the line east from Prince Rupert pay. There have been times in the past when it seemed as if the management of the road did not care whether this part of the line had any traffic or not. However, it has been evident that of recent times a great change has come over the railway management. We hope that it will continue its efforts to make this end of the road pay. One way to do so might be to take an active interest in the question of grain shipments from Prince Rupert.

#### SHORTAGE OF IRON

Japan is feeling the lack of iron just now. Formerly much of her iron ore came from that part of China at present under the control of the Chinese government at Hankow. Another source of supply was Australia but recently an embargo was placed on shipment of iron ore from mines owned and operated by Japanese. This has left the Japanese in a difficult position and made it more than ever desirable that Hankow and its rich mining district be taken.

Japan owns some iron ore deposits on the Queen Charlotte Islands and it is possible that the shortage of ore may speed up the development of those properties.

### CLEVELAND DISPLACED

Boston Red Sox Move Into Runner  
up Position in American  
League

NEW YORK, August 24 (Canadian Press)—While the leaders in the two major baseball leagues—the New York Yankees in the American and the Pittsburgh Pirates in the National—were dividing double-headers yesterday, there were some interesting changes in the standings of American League clubs. The Cleveland Indians lost both ends of a double-header to the Boston Red Sox who, as a result, ousted them from the runner up position in the league. The Detroit Tigers, by winning a double header from the Philadelphia Athletics, moved into a tie for fourth place with the Washington Senators who had a close single game victory over the St. Louis Browns. The Athletics dropped further into the cellar below the Browns. In the National League, the Cincinnati Reds, who are menacing the New York Giants for the runner-up position, continued their upward movement by blanking the Phillies while the fourth place Chicago Cubs were losing to the Giants.
