Club Brings Out Creddie Morgan

Rotarians Hear Toc H Speaker At Luncheon Meeting Yesterday Afternoon

The Prince Rupert Rotary Club, at its luncheon yesterday, decided to put Miss Creddie Morgan in as a candidate for the popularity contest in connection with the Port Day celebration.

The speaker of the day was William Talbot, secretary of the Toc H for British Columbia, with headquarters at Vancouver. He formerly lived at Kelowna and he told of a boys' club the Toc H had formed at that place as a result of which the juvenile court judge had been allowed to go as no longer needed.

The Toc H, the speaker stated, was primarily concerned with the relationship of man to man. It believed in the tripartite interest in body, mind and spirit. What was needed was the well balanced person. In Kelowna as in Prince Rupert the town depended on a seasonal occupation. While Prince Rupert existed as a result of the fishing industry Kelowna existed because of the fruit industry. The difficulty in both places was to find occupation for people during the remaining part of the year. It was to meet the problem of the young men and boys that the club was formed there and a club along somewhat similar lines was started in Prince Rupert. He asked the Rotary Club to give this their support.

Urging that friendship was one of the greatest needs, the speaker said that in all people the differences were not as marked as the similarities. The Toc H was not a service club but it made valuable contacts that proved of great value.

Among the visitors to the club were T. H. Johnston of the Victoria Rotary Club, who spoke briefly, Olof Hanson, M.P., Lieut.-Commander Donald Jarvis H. McLeod, Rev. Roy Durnford of Seal Cove, and William Dancy of Montreal.
