

LONDON, April 26: (CP)—Sir John Simon, Chancellor of the Exchequer, today boosted the British income tax rate from twenty-five per cent to 271/2 per cent to help Second Avenue of a sighting sta- pay the costs of rearmament. In his first budget speech, tion for the new practice battery |Sir John shocked the House by announcing that the income tax was being raised from five shillings on the

pound to five shilling six pence. Presenting the 1938-39 fiscal budget, the Chancellor announced the government's tatol needs as £944,-398,000 an! increase of £81,500,000 over the previous year.

The Chancellor also announced an increase in duties on tea and oil. The higher tea tax will reach into the pocketbooks of virtually every family in the land.

Sir John dropped several other bombshells, including the disclosure that the government had secretly purchased early this year huge stocks of wheat, sugar and whale oil, sufficient to last through the early months of a possible war.

The Chancellor presented the nation with the largest peacetime budget in history.

The blow of the income tax boost was softened somewhat by the announcement that the tax will not be increased this year for single persons making up to £260 or married men with one child earning up

NEW IRISH DEAL MADE

Arrangements Made Between Britain and North Ireland Following Treaty With Eire

BELFAST, April 26: (CP)-Viscount Craigavon, Prime Minister of Northern Ireland, today announced new financial arrangements with Great Britain intended to offset Northern Ireland's losses under the new treaty between Great Britain and Eire (the former Irish Free State).

Craigavon said that Northern Ireland would receive substantial British armament orders, benefits under British agricultural subsidies and unemployment insurance.
