WHIFFLETS

From The Waterfront

After spending a couple of days here while bound north in the course of a leisurely three months' cruise which they plan shall take them as far as Skagway, Mr. and Mrs. D. Bartels left at 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon for Ketchikan which port they expect to reach by the end of the week. Mr. and Mrs. Bartels are making the trip in a trim little sixteen-foot sail boat equipped with a 10 h.p. Red Wing gas engine for auxiliary power. The trip up the coast from Vancouver to Prince Rupert took them two weeks. They only call in ports when it is necessary to obtain supplies. The most of the time they spend the night by drawing up into some bay or nook and dropping their anchor. They expect to call at Prince Rupert on the return trip south. They are friends of Mr. and Mrs. W. N. Currie with whom they visited while here. Mr. Bartels is an electrical engineer.

Mosher, having arrived at 9 o'clock yesterday morning from Ioca with fuel supply for the company's local tanks sailed at 9:30 this morning for Port San Luis, California, Acting as pilot of the Albertolite on the voyage up the coast was Capt. A. S. Lewis.

Piloted by Bert Ruoff, an American commercial seaplane, with four passengers on board, paused here briefly shortly before noon on Monday. It was on the way from Seattle to Ketchikan.

ACTIVITY IN BEAR RIVER

Many Mining Properties To Be Operated In That Stewart Valley This Year

Mining activities in the Bear River Valley indicate a busy summer in this section. Three properties on the Bear and its tributaries are now under development and one other is assembling supplies and equipment for an early start on work.

H. E. Newton arrived from Victoria last Thursday and will develop the Red Reef. Last week-end men were engaged at clearing out the trail leading to the property and early this week a camp was established.

Work done at the Red Reef last year disclosed a strong vein which crosses the main tunnel at approximately 240 feet from the portal. It is planned to drift on the vein to determine its extent and values of the ore.

W. H. Tolin has a camp established at the L. L. and H. property on Bitter Creek. The crew is driving a new crosscut tunnel, at a lower level, to intersect the rich gold vein which was encountered in the No. 1 and No. 2 tunnels.

At Bitter Creek Owen McFadden, manager of the Lucky Date Company, has a crew employed at the property on Bitter Creek. A camp has been

erected and progress is being made with development work. It is planned to extend the main crosscut tunnel and also to carry out extensive surface work on the Lucky Date ground.

Matthew Little, mining engineer of Victoria, one of the members of the syndicate owning the Excelsior group on American Creek, arrived at Stewart recently from the south. Mr. Little is organizing a crew there to carry out development at this property. Supplies will be taken in and the camp established. It is understood that work will continue until fall.

The new trail on the east side of Bear River from the bridge to the Stewart-Canal Gold, under development by John Haathi, while not completed, is in use for taking supplies to that property. Mr. Haathi has a small crew of miners working and is carrying out very satisfactory exploration work.
