The brief lists the capitalized value of Alberta's resources, in cluding population, as prepared by the government's advisers and comparison cities unemployed, debt charges and payments and heavy taxation. Any correct statement autonomy. of the assets of a province, it declares, must include the capitalized value of its population terms of productive capacity.

the capital resources of the province average about \$300,000 a per son. Assuming these resources were right of capital punishment. exploited at the very low rate of one-half of one percent per annum, the present standard of living of the people of Alberta would be increased eight times. This would yield an average annual income of about \$1,500 per person or about \$6,000 per family of four jumber at the existing price level.

"While it may be argued that] such a high living standard can be secured only by the export out of the province of a very substan-'tial portion of the increased production, in order to obtain the parade of the season at the Ardiverse variety of goods for which mouries. there would be a demand, this is partially true only.

"The abundant sources of power at the disposal of the province in its natural assests of coal, oil and to a limited extent, water power rended it ideal for industrial development.
