ARGUMENT IS HEARD

Federal Council Declares Control of Banking is Exclusive Dominion Function

OTTAWA, January 12: (CP)—Argument on the constitutionality of three Alberta bills on which the Lieutenant Governor of that province reserved his assent pending the pleasure of the Governor General was being heard by the Supreme Court of Canada yesterday. The bills have to do with taxation of banks, control of credit and newspapers.

Alme Geoffrion K.C. of Montreal, chief counsel for the federal government, explained the three bills and dilated on Social Credit theories. Control of banking under the British North America Act, declared Geoffrion, was entirely a federal function.

The Court ruled that the Dominion should proceed with its case after which the province would be given ample opportunity to present its arguments.

TALKING TARIFFS

Premier of Quebec Makes Public Correspondence With Premier of New Brunswick

QUEBEC, Jan. 12: (CP)—Premier Maurice Duplessis of Quebec last night made public correspondence between himself and Premier Dystart in regard to tariff matters. The subject had been opened, Duplessis said, in a communication from Dystart who had proposed co-operation in changes in tariff arrangements with both United States and Great Britain. Duplessis said he had agreed to co-operate in such changes.

Premier Duplessis concluded a two-day conference with Premier Mitchell Hepburn on the subject of newsprint production control yesterday, no announcement being made as to the result of the deliberations.

RECESSION IS ENDING

So Industrial Leaders of United States Tell President Roosevelt in Conference

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 12.—Five industrial leaders of the United States, among them Alfred P. Sloan, president of General Motors, told President Franklin D. Roosevelt, in conference yesterday at the White House, that they believed the bottom of the present business recession had been reached and that things were on the upturn again. They assured the President that they would be glad to co-operate in measures to speed recovery.

Earlier in the day the President had been in conference with utility leaders of the country.

In connection with the early resumption of operations at the Port Edward reduction plant which has been closed down since before Christmas, H. V. Morehouse, district manager for B. C. Packers with headquarters at Nanaimo, arrived in the city on the Prince George this morning from down the coast.

Having been delayed since yesterday by heavy weather on Hecate Straits between here and Massett, C. N. R. steamer Prince John, Captain Neil McLean, is due in port at 5 o'clock this afternoon from Vancouver via the Queen Charlotte Islands and will be here until Friday night when she will sail on her return south over the same route.

C. N. R. steamer Prince George, Capt. H. E. Neddien, arrived in port on time at 10:30 this morning from Vancouver, Powell River and Ocean Falls with a fair-sized list of passengers and will sail at 4 o'clock this afternoon for Anyox and Stewart whence she is due back here tomorrow evening southbound.

VIENNA, January, 12:—Vienna was in an uproar last night with Nazi and monarchist demonstrations. At least ten mass meetings were held. German sympathizers demonstrated for Adolf Hitler and scores of automobiles were overturned when Nazis closed with police. There were banners demanding the return of the monarchy.
