REPRESENTS BRITISH GOVERNMENT

The representative of the Chamberlain government in Canada today is Sir Gerald Campbell, K.C.M.G., high From the Bastcommissioner. All communications between the British government and the government of Right Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King pass through Sir Gerald's hands. It is his duty to keep in very close touch with the activities of There's a reason. the Canadian government and to act for the British Secretary of State for the Dominions or any other department of the British government at all times. While the Governor General represents the King in Canada, he does not represent the British cabinet any more than he would represent the Australian or South African governments.

Sir Gerald recently came to Ottawa from New York. where he was British consul, to take the place of Sirl Francis Floud who a year or two ago gave several ad dresses in this city. He is 59 years of age and is said to be a good speaker and a delightful personality. He has' had a wide experience in the consular service, having served the British government in Rio de Janeiro, the Belgian Congo, Venice, Addis Ababa, Philadelphia and San Francisco before being moved to New York. He and Lady Campbell will reside in the official residence of the High Commissioner at Earnscliffe, the home of the late Sir John Macdonald.
