WHIFFLETS From the Waterfront

C.P.R. steamer Princess Louise, Capt. S. K. Gray, making the last of three voyages in place of the Princess Adelaide, which has been off for annual overhaul at Victoria, arrived in port at 1:15 this afternoon from the south and will sail at 10 p.m. on her return to Vancouver and waypoints.

There was a light list of 34 passengers aboard the steamer Princess Norah which was in port yesterday afternoon southbound from Skagway to Vancouver, there being 34 in all including three disembarking here. The traffic now is northward and, to accommodate many travelling next trip, the Princess Louise is taking that voyage in place of the Norah.

Bringing in one carload of frozen fish for transshipment East over Canadian National Railways, the freighter Evelyn Berg, Capt. Allan Fulmer, bound from Ketchikan to Seattle, is due in port tomorrow.

Northland Transportation Co.'s motorship liner Northland, Capt. Len Williams, is due in port this week-end from Ketchikan with six carloads of frozen fish for transshipment East over Canadian National Railways. After discharging the vessel will proceed to Seattle.
