merican Fisheries Expert Says Japs Are Better Acquainted With Alaska Fisheries Than Are Americans

WASHINGTON, D.C., June 7: (CP) - United States Congress heard today that Japan's government "undoubtedly" knows more than most Americans know about the red salmon which are the basis of a \$12,000,000 industry in the Bristol Bay area of Alaska.

The House appropriations committee made public this statement by Ward Bower, chief of the Bureau of Fisheries, Alaska Divis-

Bower said: "The Bureau needs \$76,000 so we may round out wholly inadequate information now available and be able to negetiate with others on a proper basis regarding off-shore salmon fishing."

Bower added that observers had seen Japanese vessels taking salmon about 25 miles off-shore from Alaska last year.
