McCAFFERY'S LOGIC

The address of M. P. McCaffery to the Chamber of Commerce the other evening was unanswerable logic, clear as crystal. He said in effect. The government is buying the wheat from the farmers at a fancy price, therefore they own it. The government owns the railway and is anxious to make it pay. The government owns the Prince Rupert elevator and presumably would like to make it pay. It would be a simple thing for the government to route some of its wheat to Prince Rupert over its own road and put it in its own elevator, especially at a time when the elevators are glutted in Vancouver and the government is paying five cents a bushel extra to carry the grain east.

The government is sending some of its wheat to Fort Churchill where it must remain all winter whether it is A. Bury wanted elsewhere or not. Prince Rupert has a harbor that is open all the year round and wheat can be shipped from it

at any time. If Prince Rupert is to be continually ignored and slighted and handicapped as it has been in the past, it might be a good thing to consider whether it would be a Basso-Bert good thing to ask Alaska to enlarge the Panhandle so as to owen include this city.
