DOMINION DAY HERE

Arrangements Completed For Observance of National Holiday

Arrangements for tomorrow's Dominion Day celebration have been completed. The success of the celebration will really depend upon the support given it by the citizens generally. A full program of sports has been arranged.

The city is co-operating by supplying a fire truck which will lead the parade. Then will follow the Boys' Band under Bandmaster Robert Greenfield. The junior football teams representing Booth and Borden School will be provided with accommodation by Casey Vink. Then the children and the public generally will follow.

The Junior Football game will begin the program. There will be the flag raising ceremony. Premier T. D. Pattullo will give a short talk and then City Commissioner Alder will speak. Detachments of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and the 102nd Battery will provide guards of honor as the salute is given and the people will join in the singing of "O Canada," the Prince Rupert Boys' Band accompanying. Then will follow the sports.

The children's sports will take place with the relay race for teams of four from the three football teams competing for the Spartan Cup, a special attraction and taking place after the twelfth event. The junior sports will be completed and then will take place the senior football, the final of the Dominion Day Cup.

WHIFFLET'S From The Waterfront

Southbound from Alaska to Vancouver after a special cruise voyage which included calls at Sitka and certain other points of interest not included on the regular schedules, C.P.R. steamer Princess Charlotte, Capt. William Palmer, arrived in port at 8 o'clock this morning and was here until 12:30 noon. The Princess Charlotte had a capacity list of 222 tourist passengers of whom two disembarked here.

Bringing in a full list of passengers, consisting largely of tourists, C.N.R. steamer Prince Charles, Capt. James Watt, arrived in port at 11:15 this morning from Vancouver via the Queen Charlotte Islands and will sail at 10:30 Saturday night on her return south over the same route. Most of the tourists who arrived on the Prince Charles will transfer tomorrow to the steamer Prince George to make the trip to Anyox and Stewart and return to Vancouver. The Prince George tomorrow will be bringing in tourists who will transfer to the Prince Charles Saturday evening to return south via the Queen Charlotte Islands after making the run to Anyox and Stewart. Coming north this voyage, the Prince Charles was the first vessel to call at the new B.C. Packers wharf at Pacofi.

Halibut landings at Seattle yesterday totalled 91,000 pounds from four boats as follows: Vansee, 39,000 pounds, San Juan, 7½c; Betty Jane, 18,000, Booth, 7¼c and 6c; Blanco, 18,000, Whiz, 7½c and 6c; Flint, 16,000, San Juan, 7c and 6c. (1,000 pounds of ling cod, 4c.)

HOW TO MAKE ICED TEA
