DEFENSELESS AS ETHIOPIA

"Canada is as defenseless as Ethiopia and much more desirable," stated Rev. H. R. Trompour, in an address to the descendents of the United Empire Loyalists at the celebration of the 155th anniversary of the historic migration to Canada from the United States, a migration that was motivated not from greed or desire for gain but by purely patriotic fervor.

The Loyalists left the United States because they refused to give up their British connection and swear allegiance to the new government. They left homes and friends and trekked to what is now Eastern Canada where they hewed out for themselves new homes in the wilderness. The memory of these men and women is cherished in Canada for they have proved to be a steadying influence through the years which followed their arrival.
