## RESCUED

Survivors of Greek Ship Which Blew Up Taken Aboard British Vessels

LONDON, April 11.—Three British tankers arrived yesterday at the Greek steamer Mount Kyllene drifting in two shattered parts several hundred miles north of the Azores following an explosion. Seamen clinging to the two portions of the vessel, which were still afloat, were rescued - sixteen from the forepart and thirteen from the after part.
