Operate Fewer Fishing Boats

Japanese Swordfish Competition Is Felt on Atlantic Coast

BOSTON, June 18: (CP)- Not more than 25 schooners are expected to engage in swordfishing out of Boston and Gloucester this season. In recent years a fleet of between 50 and 60 vessels have operated.

Fishermen contend much of the profit has been taken out of this branch of the fishing industry by the rapidly increasing imports of frozen swordfish from Japan.

A fleet of about 15 schooners left Boston and Gloucester in quest of swordfish, joining several that had left earlier in the season.
