The same correspondent hints that, after the Rowell Commission has reported, it is quite possible that the people of the Dominion may be consulted before the recommendations are put into force. They will appeal over the heads of the provincial politicians to the good sense of the Canadian people. He suggests that the Dominion has drifted far from the course the Fathers of Confederation plotted for it. The idea of a strong central federal authority has failed to be realized, the provincial power having magnified itself at the expense of the federal. It is thought that the Rowell Commission may rescue the ideal of the framers of the constitution.

The issue is whether Canada is to be a country of loosely knit provinces without any real central authority or whether Canada shall be a real nation with a central authority and that the provinces be secondary as was or-

iginally planned. It is suggested that the provinces have been spending to much money and have increased the debt of the nation to an extent never intended. Canada has had to bear the cost of war pensions amounting to approximately fifty million dollars annually and the railway losses amounting to about the same sum. The final summing up of the despatch will be found interesting:

"In spite of the best efforts of the Hepburns, the Aberharts and the Duplessis to poison the minds of the public the conviction is held federally that the Rowell Commission report will be given the reception that its intrinsic national value will merit."

Evidently Mr. Hepburn is an astute politician and he has many friends both in the Ottawa cabinet and outside and he is spoken of as a possible successor to the present Prime Minister. At this distance it seems as if the latest coup will have strengthened him with various financial interests but injured him in the eyes of the majority of the people of the country.
