Empire Hub In Party Dress Nightly As Public Service Holds Women By Day

By MOLLIE MCGEE Canadian Press Correspondent LCNDON, Nov. 17: (CP)-Society affairs of the "little season" that lasts till Christmas are in fuli swing in London. Dances, balls, dinners, theatre and restaurant parties take place nightly and have their pictures in the papers, but, behind this pleasant surface serious work is going on. Busy with the women's army Lady Londonderry has abandoned arrangements for her customary eve-of-parliament reception at her great house on Park Lane.



Missouri Priest Conducts Haven for People Desiring Quiet and Rest

ST. LOUIS, Mo., Nov. 17: (CP)-Tired St. Louis businessmen have discovered Father James P. Monaghan's "thinking resort." It is all haven, operated by Catholics but open also to Jews and Protestants. where a man can get by himself for meditation.

"Isolated from the world, placed in an environment where there are beautiful gardens and a broad view of forest and stream, man is set! to thinking of the spiritual side of his nature," says Father Monaghan.
