PRE-EMPTIONS

ACANT, anreserved, surveyed Crown

lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age, and by allens on declaring intention to become British subjects, conditional upon residence, occupation and improvement. Full information concerning Pre-emptions is given in Bulletin No. 1. Land Series, "How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge by addressing the Department of Lands, Victoria, B.C.; Bureau of Provincial Information. Victoria, or any Government Agent. Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes within reasonable distance of road, school and marketing facilities and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying ever 5,000 board feet per acre east of the Coast Range and 8 000 feet per acre west of that Range. Applications for pre-emptions are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division in which the land applied for is situated, on printed forms obtained from the Commissioner. Pre-emptions must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$15 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown

Fre-emptions carrying part time conditions of occupation are also granted. PURCHASE OR LEASE Applications are received for purchase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland, for agricultural purposes.
