Miss Priestly then told how diphtheria, which caused such ravages at the beginning of the century can now be prevented by the injection of diphtheria toxoid and how by means of the Schick test the doctor could make sure that the child had developed protection substances in its blood after the three roses of toxoid had been given. The family physician should be consulted with respect to this matter and parents should obtain information about the prevention of disease by the various methods of immunization.

SAFETY ON STREETS

Editor, Daily News: It was decided at a recent meeting of this organization that, in accordance with a program instituted by the Junior Chamber of Commerce of Canada, it would be advisable to study the traffic situation as it exists in Prince Rupert today and take what steps are considered necessary to promote and ensure the safety of all concerned.

Reference to past records discloses the fact that this city has been remarkably free from even minor accidents and, acting solely on the premise that "prevention is better than cure," the committee appointed to deal with the situation has seen fit to institute "Safety Week" from Monday February 28 to Saturday March 5 with the idea of eliminating as far as possible all street accidents.

Through the co-operation of the Government Agent it has been made possible to contact automobile drivers by means of printed traffic regulations and suggestions and, through the co-operation of the inspector of schools and the school principals, to reach all those attending schools, which category includes the majority of bicyclists. In the case of High School students and the senior grades of the public schools,

speakers are being sent to address classes and, in the case of the junior grades of the public schools the teachers are emphasizing their present safety instruction.

We are appealing through your columns to all those who do not come under the above classifications to take all possible precautions when using the streets by:

1. Walking on the sidewalks where they are provided.
2. Crossing only at the corners.
3. Making absolutely certain that crossing can be made with safety from vehicular traffic.
4. Where sidewalks are not provided walking at the side of the road "against the line of traffic."

We would also appeal to elders to see to it that children are prevented at all times from playing on the roads and taught the few simple rules mentioned above.

We would much appreciate the whole-hearted support of each and every member of this community in a cause which will undoubtedly be the means of saving any one of us from possible worry, discomfort, financial loss or perhaps loss of life.
