NEW YEARS AT NEWTOWN

The Kitselas Indians Celebrated the Occasion with an Entertainment.

(Special Correspondence.)
Newton, Jan. 6. — Newton, which, since the commencement of the G. T. P. and more particularly since the beginning of the passenger service, has become well known to the Prince Rupert public as the "end of the steel," has an importance of its own apart from that fact. It is easily the largest and best organized village between Port Simpson and Hazelton. The people belong to the Kitselas tribe and speak a dialect of the Tsimpsian language.

Christmas Day was spent in quiet family parties. On Tuesday a splendid entertainment was given by the school children, comprising solos, recitations, choruses and action songs. Some who had the privilege of being present remarked that few white public schools of the same size could give a better entertainment. The children were trained by Miss Edgar.

Thursday the big folk entertained the children with a fine Christmas tree laden with all the varied merchandise of Santa Claus.

The potlatch, with its attendant evils, has become a thing of the past. Its place was taken on New Year's Day by a basket social held at the Mission. Sufficient funds were raised to buy a new heater and a gasoline lighting plant for the church. A most enjoyable evening was spent.

A TRIUMPH IN PLASTIC SURGERY.

Memphis, Tenn., Jan. 8.—By cutting his throat and binding his right arm to the part of the throat, thus opened two Memphis physicians have supplied J. Allen Hart with a new mouth and chin. The operation is considered one of the most difficult feats in plastic surgery ever performed.
Hart, who is now 19, has had 90 lower lip since he was two years old, when gangrene, following salivation, ate away the flesh of the lower part of his face, leaving his lower teeth wholly exposed and causing the muscles of the interior of his mouth to grow to the lower jaw so that his mouth was half closed.
After about three weeks the arm will be cut free and Hart will

face the world with a new set of features.
There will remain, however, one difficulty to be surmounted. It will be necessary to tattoo the lower lip with red pigment to make it look altogether like a lip. But that will be easy.
The operation lasted several hours. It was witnessed by scores of interested physicians. The whole operation, down to the minutest detail, was figured out a week before the patient went on the table, and the surgeons had before them while they worked plans and specifications of the new mouth and chin.
All Hart's trouble was caused by a sour pickle eaten after he had been given calomel.
