CHAS. HUNTER'S LITTLE SPEECH

In Five Minutes He Said More Than Some Speakers Said in Half an Hour—Is a Labor Worker.

Given five minutes to reply to Alderman Hilditch on Monday, Charles Hunter undertook to prove that Alderman Hilditch did not give the 45-cent rate to the workers. "Nobody gave it to us," he said. "We took it." (Applause.)

He told of the deputation of workmen to the City Hall, "including Fellow Worker Morse, whom Alderman Clayton called a conspirator." He was no conspirator. We pay him wages to attend to the clerical work of our organization and he has no voice at all in our affairs. Alderman Hilditch and Patullo approached us asking us to wait until the present contracts were finished. Some of them aren't finished yet! But we stayed with our demand and got the 45-cent rate for ourselves. Our quarrel was with the contractors, not the Council, and the one mistake made was when a few of our hot-headed lads lost control of themselves after pulling off the station gangs and got into trouble at Kelly's cut. They are paying for that now. As for me, why I stand for Alderman Newton is simply because I believe he will give us a clean government."

Home Hints.

To Remove Machine Oil Stains—Rub with a little butter or lard and wash with warm water and soap.

To ease a corn which is often painful from long standing touch it with a little oil of peppermint and the soreness will be wonderfully eased.

Garbage pails should be emptied daily, and then rinsed in cold water. Once a week scald with hot soda water and scrub well, then dry in the sun.

Varnished wallpaper will stand washing, therefore, do not omit to have every room papered in this way washed once a year at least. It will improve the appearance of the paper and make the room sweeter.

Do Not Iron Curtains—Lay a sheet on the carpet and pin the curtains out on this. If very large fold in half before pinning out. Be sure to keep the curtains quite square, and do not pin them too tightly or they will not look well when hung.
