Special Committee Will Go Into Possibilities of Holding Gathering in Prince Rupert

Massett Inlet was Failure But South End May Be Better

The executive of the Prince Rupert Gyro Club, at a meeting yesterday, named Orme Stuart chairman of a special committee to go into the possibilities of holding the 1939 district convention of Gyro in Prince Rupert and report back to the club at the earliest possible date. Prince Rupert has the first call on the convention which has been invited to New Westminster.

Packers operating the cannery at Shannon Bay are believed to have taken a serious loss and the failure has already had a very depressing effect upon business and conditions,
