Boston Bruins and Toronto Maple Leafs Play to Tie in Hockey

BOSTON, Nov. 16: (CP)—Play ing a one to one overtime tie with Toronto Maple Leafs last night, Boston Bruins assumed exclusive possession of second place in the National Hockey League standing, being in runner-up position to the so far unbeaten Chicago Black Hawks.

New York Rangers, who had won over the Detroit Red Wings Sunday night, scored another victory over the luckless Detroit crew at Madison Square Garden last night to join the New York Americans in a tie for fourth place behind Maple Leafs. It was a two to nil shut-out, the second victory for the Rangers in as many starts and the fourth defeat for the Detroiters without a win so far this season.

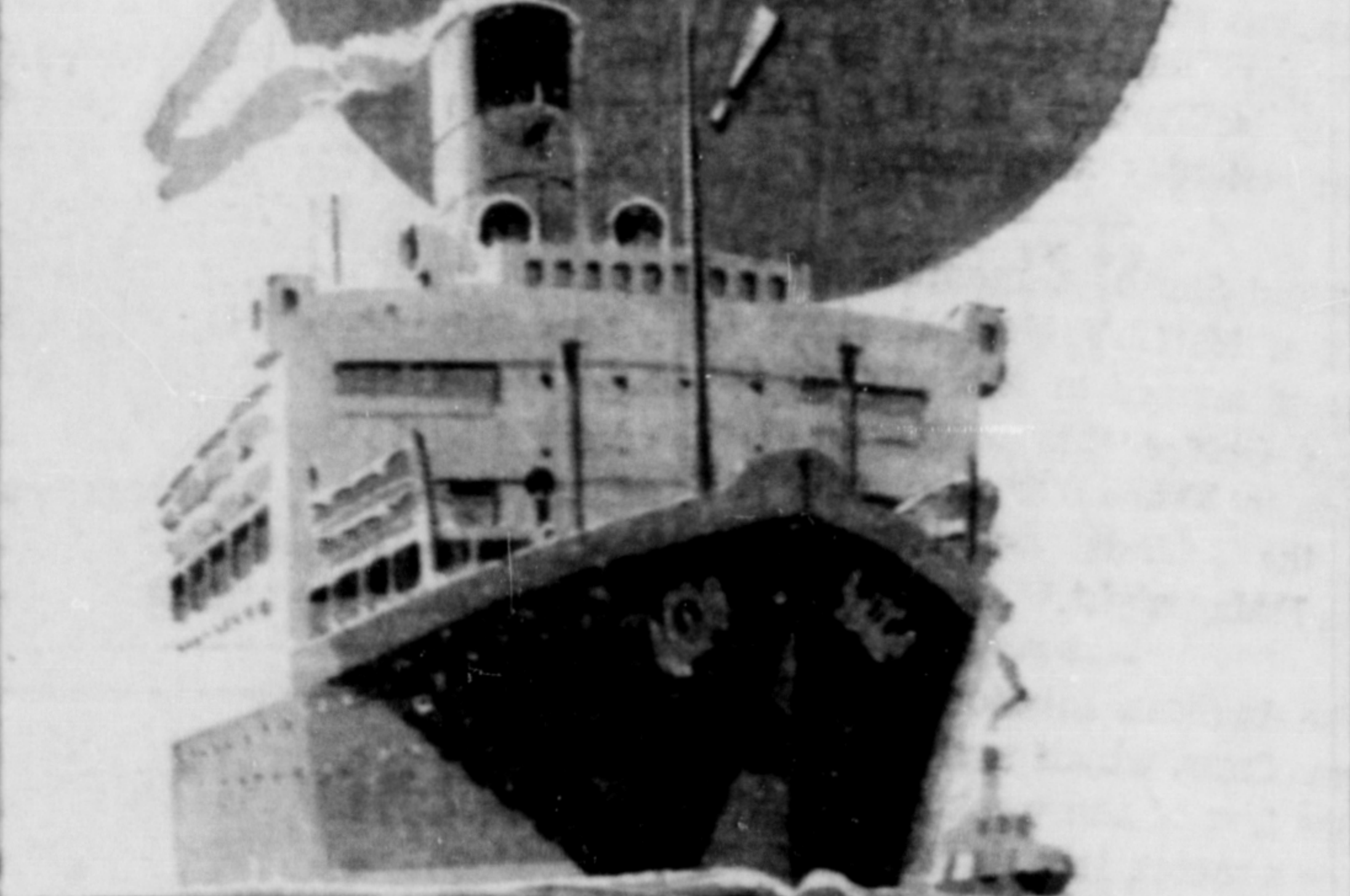
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
