FINEST 'CROOK' IN RUPERT

Not a Politician, but the Yellow Cedar Stem-post of the New Large Launch Being Built for Capt. Babington.

One of the finest "crooks" of yellow cedar ever used in boat building in Prince Rupert was brought over from the mainland across Shavatlans Passage recently by H. Johnston, of the Cow Bay boat house. The crook is very massive and finely curved for the stem-post of the large new gasoline boat Mr. Johnston is building for Capt. Babington. Three days were spent in the bush in the search for a suitable yellow cedar tree, and after the crook had been located it took a day or two to rough hew it, and get it down to the water's edge to be shipped. Yesterday it was taken up to the building shed where the keel of the new boat and sternpost are in position, and today the stempost is being shaped. The yellow cedar of Prince Rupert district is famous for boat building, and has been sent to yacht yards on the Atlantic coast.

Notice is hereby given that an application will be made to the Legislature of the Province of British Columbia at its next session for an act amending Section 3 of the British Columbia & Alaska Railway Act, 1910 (Ch. 56, Statutes of British Columbia, 1910), by striking out all the words after the word "Columbia" in Line 10 of said Section and substituting therefor the following:

"And from Fort George in a north-easterly direction to the valley of the Parsup River by way of Fort McLeod, thence along the Parsup River to a junction with the Peace River, thence along the valley of the Finlay River through Sifton Pass, thence down the Skeena River to a junction with the main line at Telegraph Creek; also powers to build branch lines either through the Pine River or Peace River passes to the eastern boundary of British Columbia, or by way of the most feasible route, or in the alternative by the most feasible route between Lytton and Teslin Lake, also to build from a point on said line of railway to the City of Vancouver or from the City of Vancouver to a point on said line, by the most feasible route."

And further, for an act extending the time within which the company has to commence construction and expend ten per cent of its capitalization.
