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SCHUSCHNIGG'S UNHAPPY TIME

According to despatches from Europe Chancellor von Schuschnigg of Austria is to take a plebiscite of the people of Austria on the matter of Austrian independence.

According to despatches from London the German Nazi chief bludgeoned Schuschnigg into accepting the proposal that Germany should practically take control of Austria through the Austrian section of the Nazi party. Later the chancellor refused to consent to the total Germanizing of the country and the plebiscite is the result.

According to one story cabled from London, Schuschnigg, on his arrival at Hitler's residence was ushered into a room in which were well known members of the Nazi party of Austria who told him exactly what they thought of him. Then came an interview with four army generals who put up an ultimatum that either he accede to their requests or Germany would invade their country. Following that was an interview with Hitler who, in rather more diplomatic language, urged the same course with the ultimatum that, if it were refused, the continued independence of Austria could not be guaranteed.

DETERMINED TO WIN

Evidently Germany and Italy are determined that the Spanish government shall be crushed before the civil war in that country is ended. According to reports they are insisting that, on arrival of the withdrawal envoys in Spain, the Franco-Spanish border shall be closed and that six weeks later the insurgent ports shall be closed. This would give opportunity for running arms and ammunition to the insurgents for six weeks after the government is shut off from its sources of supplies. The ships going to fetch the Italian troops from Spain could carry arms and ammunition for the rebels. It is hardly any wonder that Anthony Eden refused to enter into such a bargain. His sense of fairness would not allow him to do so.

ARE THEY DOOMED?

The question which now presents itself is whether, under present conditions, the Spanish government is doomed and the insurgents bound to win. With very considerably more than half of their territory gone and with little real support from outside, it seems as if the loyalists would not be able to hold out and eventually win back the part of the country already under Franco's rule. It seems rather tragic but it is no more tragic than Abyssinia and China. It seems as if we were in for a period of physical force and mechanized strength.


