It was useful for party purposes in 1911 when co-operation with the United States was refused by the nation and yet the 1911 policy was carried out to a large extent recently when a reciprocity treaty On Top of the World! gave Prince Rupert fishermen a cent a pound more for their halibut than they had been receiving prior to the carrying out of the policy. In 1911 Canadian people voted against reciprocity. Two years ago they hailed it as a means of economic salvation. Once more an attempt is being made to raise the flag and wave it politically but the people of the country are becoming wise to these political manoeuvres.
