THE SOUTH AFRICAN VICTORY

"The victory for the Hertzog government serves a new reminder on the world at large that the British sys-i tem of responsive and responsible administration can hold its own against all the assaults of totalitarianism," says the Victoria Times.

"Not many years ago the man who again has been endorsed as South Africa's Prime Minister-already having held that position for 14 years—was leading his countrymen in the field against British soldiery, who almost up to the time he became Prime Minister in 1924 still clung to the belief that South Africa ought to cut the Imperial painter and become a republic. Not until he had attended his first Imperial Conference in 1926, as the leader of a governmentt within the British Empire, did he frankly confess, after the famous Balfour declaration which formed the basis for the Statute of Westminster, that there was nothing he could obtain for South Africa as a republic which he could not obtain as a member of the British family of self-governing nations. From that momentous gathering which heralded the new orientation of politica' management in the Commonwealth he went back to his native South Africa and readjusted his domestic point of view.

General Hertzog's crowning triumph in the Union's parliamentary realm came in 1934, when he fused his Na tionalist Party with General Smuts' South African Party and called it the United Party of South Africa. These two political antagonists had thus buried their old ani mosities. The election verdict pays tribute to their wis
