Heart Attack After Serious Illness Proves Fatal For Chief Magistrate of Puget Sound City

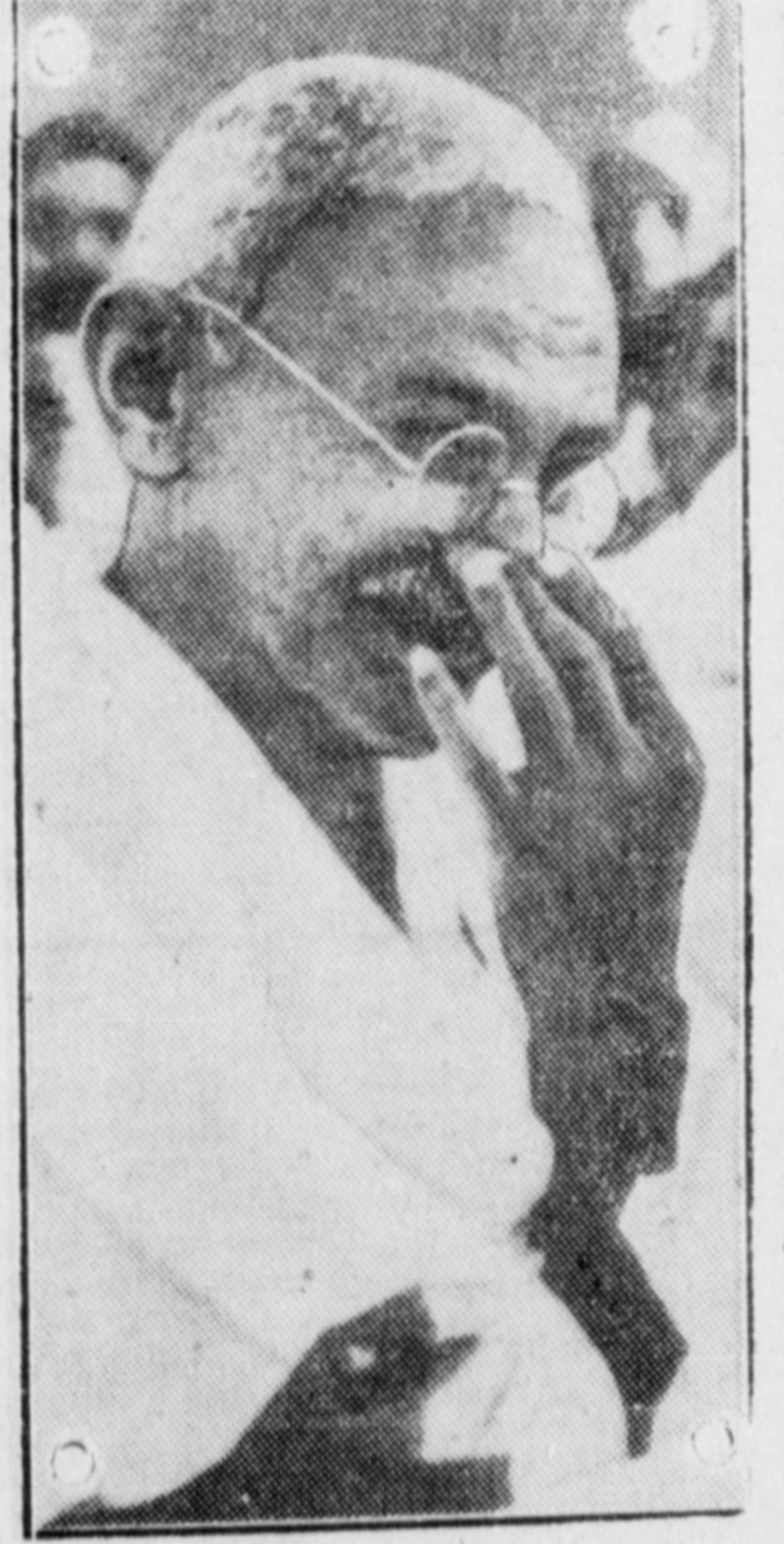

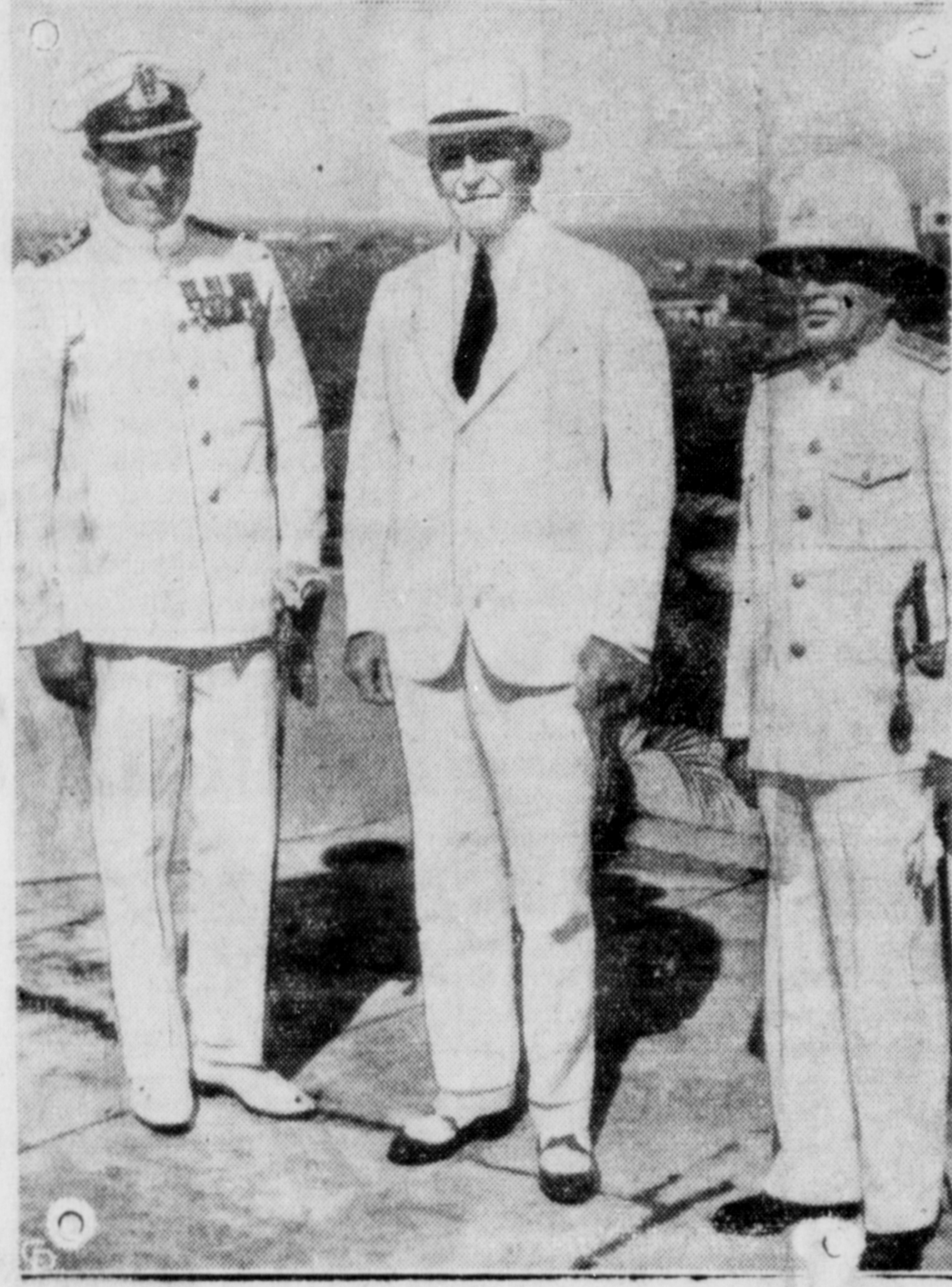
GANDHI SMILES
