WHIFFLETS

From the Waterfront

The conference of Seattle, British Columbia and Alaska halibut boat owners and fishermen, in session here last week, recommended that no lower price for halibut livers than in 1937 be accepted this year.

On the last of three voyages she has been making on the Vancouver-Prince Rupert-Stewart run in place of the Catala which has been off at Vancouver for annual overhaul, Union steamer Cardena, Capt. James Findlay, arrived in port at 7 o'clock last evening from the south and sailed at 9 p.m. for northern points whence she will return here tomorrow morning southbound. The Catala will be back on the run next Sunday evening northbound and the Cardena will go back to her regular route on which the Venture has been relieving for several weeks.

Fishing Gazette of New York which has just come to hand shows the enormous amount of fresh Atlantic fish which has been landed on the east coast and which is, undoubtedly, having its effect on the movement of frozen halibut. In January at Boston alone, not taking New York into account, 234 trips aggregating no less than 21,613,000 pounds, were landed. Weather for fishing has been favorable on the North Atlantic.

Capt. Paul Armour, popular manager of the Armour Salvage Co., who has been a patient in the Prince Rupert General Hospital for the past week, was reported this morning to be doing nicely after having undergone a serious operation yesterday afternoon.

According to advice received in the city at week-end, the bungalow of Louis Locker, well known logging operator, at Kumeleon Inlet in Greville Channel had broken loose and was in danger of being lost. Mr. Locker is at present at Chismore Inlet.

The well known local halibut boats Takla and Pair of Jacks were both ashore in a fog near Calamity Point, Vancouver Harbor, on Friday. Neither were seriously damaged, both refloating on a rising tide.

HE ROSE RAPIDLY

Canadian Archbishop Was Elevated From Parish Priestship to High Catholic Rank

KINGSTON, Ont., Feb. 23: (CP)—Most Rev. Michael Joseph Spratt, Archbishop of Kingston, who died last week, was a native of the township of Ops, born near Lindsay, Ontario, in 1854. Educated in the Lindsay schools, later going to St. Michael's College, Toronto, he took his course in philosophy and theology at Pointe Levis and the Grand Seminary, Montreal, and was ordained in June, 1882, by the late Archbishop Cleary. The late Archbishop McEvoy of Toronto, was ordained at the same time.

After his ordination Father Spratt assisted his brother, Rev. Thomas J. Spratt, at Wolfe Island for a time and was appointed curate at Prescott and later parish priest at Kitley. He built the presbytery at Toledo and a splendid church and priest's abode at Elgin, and succeeded the late Father Twomey as pastor at Trenton. Two years later he was appointed pastor of St. Michael's Church, Belleville.

In 1911 he was named Archbishop of Kingston, a rather unusual appointment as up to that time his highest post was parish priest. It was apparent the talent and ability of Father Spratt was recognized by the Holy See in the appointment.

Dr. Spratt was consecrated Archbishop of Kingston, November 30, 1911 by his Excellency Monsignor Stagni, at that time apostolic delegate. The late Right Rev. M. J. Fallon, Bishop of London, preached the sermon.



Synopses of Mining Laws

MINERAL ACT

Free Miners' Certificates
Any person over the age of eighteen, and any Joint Stock Company is entitled to enter upon all waste lands of the Crown and upon any other lands wherein the minerals other than coal are reserved to the Crown and its licensees (with specific reservations) for the purpose of prospecting for minerals locating claims and mining. The fee for an individual for a Free Miners' Certificate is \$2.50 for one year. To a Joint Stock Company having a capital of \$100,000 or less the fee for a year is \$50.00; if capitalized beyond that sum the fee is \$100.00. The Free Miners' Certificate may be obtained for one year or some subsequent 31st of May. Certificates may be obtained for any part of a year terminating on 31st of May for a proportionately less fee. Free Miners' Certificates are also applicable to the Placer Mining Act.

Mineral Claims

Size: 51.85 acres.
Recording fee: \$2.50 per claim.
Representation: Assessment work to the extent of \$100.00 must be done each year and recorded on or before the anniversary date of record of the claim. Cash in the sum of \$100.00 may be paid in lieu of such assessment work. Fee for recording assessment work \$2.50. If the recording assessment work has been performed within the year but not recorded within that time a free miner may within 60 days hereafter record such assessment work upon payment of an additional fee of \$10.00. The actual cost of the survey of a mineral claim to an amount not exceeding \$100.00 may also be recorded as assessment work to meet the assessment work to the extent of \$500.00 for each paid of a like amount is recorded. A survey made by the owner of such claim is entitled to a Crown Grant on payment of a fee of \$20.00 and giving the necessary notices required by the Act.

PLACER MINING ACT

Four types of placer claims: Creek diggings, dry diggings, and precious stone diggings. (For details see Part II, Placer Mining Act.) Representation: A placer claim must be worked by the owner or someone on his behalf continuously as far as practicable during working hours. Lascars and leaves of absence may be declared by the Gold Commissioner under certain conditions. To hold a placer claim for more than one year it must be re-recorded before the expiration of the record or record.

Placer Mining Leases

Size and method of staking, etc.
Rightly staked in extent staked along a "location line" not more than one-half mile in length. In this line one bend or change of direction is permitted. Where a straight line is followed two posts only are necessary, i.e., an "initial post" and a "final post." Where there is a change of direction a legal post must be placed to mark the point of the said change. The leasehold is allowed a width not in excess of one-quarter mile. The locator is required within thirty days after the date of the location to post a notice in the office of the Mining Recorder setting out the name of the applicant; the number of his free miner's certificate; the date of location; the number of feet lying to the right and left of the location line; and the approximate area or size of the ground.

Dredging leases on rivers for five miles below low-water mark are also granted.
Fees: Annual rental on placer mining lease, \$20.00; annual development work required to be expended, \$25.00; annual rental on dredging lease, \$25.00 per mile; annual development work required to be expended, \$1,000.00 per mile; the value of any new plant or machinery employed to count as money expended in development. Fee for recording certificate of work, \$2.50. Lease fee, \$5.00.

Provisional Free Miners' Certificates, (Placers) Act

Department of Mines Act
Among other things these Acts provide for the staking and representing of placer claims without payment of fees and assistance to prospectors by free assays, etc.

A detailed synopsis of the above Acts, also the "Mines Development Act," "Mineral Survey and Development Act," "Iron and Steel Bounties Act," and "Phosphate-mining Act," are available at the Department of Mines, Victoria.
