RACE OF GODS

When Earl de la Warr was visiting Australia for the anniversary celebrations he was so impressed with the marvellous physique of the young men and women of the surf life-saving teams who took part that he used strong words in expressing his appreciation. He is reported to have said: "I cannot help thinking that if all would follow the example of the Prime Minister in regard to the size of their families, Australia would soon be populated by a race of gods and goddesses." Premier J. A. Lyons, it may be explained, has eleven children.

Another visitor to that country from England is quoted as follows: "A European traveller cannot help receiving the impression that here is being evolved a race so much improved on the British that the parent stock has almost lost its identity."

BRITISH OPINION

Evidently British opinion is still opposed to the Chamberlain foreign policy as shown by the result of the recent by-election in the West Fulham division of London. The people there are evidently strong for Anthony Eden and the policy of firmness in dealing with the European dictators.

MISSING PERSONS

So many persons are missing in Austria since the German annexation that it has become necessary to set up a separate department of state to have charge of their property. They have found it better to leave the country than to remain under the conditions which they find there. One of these people who is at present a political refugee is a banker who owns considerable Prince Rupert property. He is in Switzerland just now. Presumably he will have removed some of his money beyond the clutches of Der Fuehrer.

LOOKING FOR A PRESIDENT

The United States will spend the next two years in seeking a president. It has been announced that Franklin D. will not again be a candidate and, even if he were, there is considerable doubt whether or not he could be elected. The opposing party also seems to be without a leader so there should be plenty of political discussions. The off-year elections this fall will tend to indicate how the wind is blowing and almost immediately after that the campaign for the presidential contest will commence in a quiet way, working gradually up to the climax in the autumn of 1940.

CHANGES IN GAME LAWS

Rod and Gun Club Seeking Amendments to Both Fishing and Hunting Regulations

Important changes in the angling and hunting regulations in this district were advocated at the annual meeting of the Prince Rupert Rod and Gun Club last night. There was a good attendance and much interest was taken in the proceedings.

As for trout fishing, it was decided to request that the season be opened throughout the district on May 1.

A two-month close season for steelhead fishing in streams commencing March 1 is also being asked.

There will be the usual planting of trout eggs in Prudhomme and Diana Lakes.

A change in the deer hunting season from September 15-November 30, as at present, to September 1-October 31, is being asked.

Trail And Cornwall To Meet In Allan Cup Final; Western Final Has Sensational End

SASKATOON, April 9: (CP)—Trail Smoke Eaters, with a sensational finish in a second overtime period, defeated Port Arthur Bear Cats 7 to 3 at the Saskatoon Arena last night for a third straight victory in the Western Canada Allan Cup hockey semi-finals, thus qualifying to meet Cornwall Flyers next week in the final for the

world's senior amateur hockey championship trophy. Cornwall entered the final by defeating Quebec Aces two to nothing at Ottawa last night. It is the first time in smelter town history that the Smoke Eaters have advanced to the final of Stanley Cup competition.

Regulation time in last night's game here finished with the count even at two all. There was no scoring in the first period. The Smoke Eaters sank a counter in the second and another in the third. Then the Bear Cats got started and made the equalizers during the last ten minutes. The first overtime period was unproductive of scoring. Soon after the start of the second overtime period, Trail moved into the lead, Port Arthur evening it up within a minute. Then the Smoke Eaters went wild and, before the smoke had cleared, had rapped in three goals to end the series with a burst of scoring speed, one of the goals being actually kicked into the net he was guarding by the Port Arthur goalkeeper, Jimmy Hill, in the course of the bombardment.

The British Columbia team was good value for its victory. Only the good work of Jimmy Hill, the Bear Cats' net-minder, prevented even more scoring. Benoit, Duchak, Dame and Wawinak were the goal getters for Trail and Gordon and McCormack for Port Arthur.

It was a rough, slashing, wide-open game with no less than twenty penalties—ten against each side.
