Case of Supposed Smallpox Discovered on Board at Q. M. I .-Passenger Came from Rupert -May Be False Alarm.

Princess Beatrice arrived in port etc. Good entrance from lane. yesterday afternoon it was made known at once to the waterfront officials and her agents here that she had landed a passenger from O. M. Helgerson, Ltd. Prince Rupert at Queen Charlotte City who was believed to be suf- | Real Estate and Rentals fering from smallpox. Efforts had been made by the officers on board to get into communication with Victoria to see about quarantining the ship here. At 1 p. m. no information had been received and the vessel was kept isolated at the wharf. A wire arrived shortly afterward from Dr. Fagan, quarantine officer at Victoria, ordering the Beatrice to proceed to William's Head to be quarantined. No passengers, of course, could go south with her. It is said that the case of supposed smallpox may not turn out to be so serious after all. The patient was not a foreigner, and the complaint was apparently
