

VOTING NEXT WEEK

Printers-The election next week in the United States when many governors, senators, congressmen and others are chosen in various parts of the country will be a pretty fair guide as to what is likely to happen two years hence at the presidential election. If there is a strong swing toward Republicanism, it seems likely there will be a revulsion against Roosevelt policies when Roosevelt or his Democratic successor comes up for endorsement.

We are inclined to think the change of sentiment may not be as great as many people imagine. It is difficult to oppose a spending program. The average person is not concerned particularly with sound policies as long as the dinner pail is kept full. "Let the future take care of itself," seems to be the policy of the average workingman.

And yet it seems plain to the most obtuse mind that the spending program of the United States cannot continue indefinitely. Even four years beyond the present term, which would mean six years in all from now, would be extremely dangerous to say the least.
