## VETERANS PROBLEM

Labor Organizations Trying To Care For Men Returning From Spain

VANCOUVER, Nov. 1: (CP) The problem of readjustment to Canadian life is facing veterans of the Spanish Civil War filtering back to Vancouver in ever-increasing numbers a year or more of service with the international brigades of the government army. A dozen are here already and 50

more are expected within the next few months. Many are maimed and all are jobless.

There are no pensions for thei young men who went to fight for another country on the other side of the world. At present a rehabilitation fund established by the Friends of the Mackenzie-Papineau Battalion provides wounded veterans with medical aid and an allowance of \$6 a week.

Contributions to the fund come chiefly from labor organizations. Recently the village of Sointula, Finnish fishing settlement on Malcolm Island, 200 miles north of here, gave more than \$200. The financial strain, however, becomes more severe with the return of each veteran.

Of the dozen men here, five suffer from war disabilities. Marcus Haldane lost a leg; Charlie! Beaser has an unhealed shrapnel wound in his leg; Jim Bell's right arm is crippled; Kris Kristianson has an injured shoulder and Arthur Tazzaman still has a piece of shrapnel in his right side.
