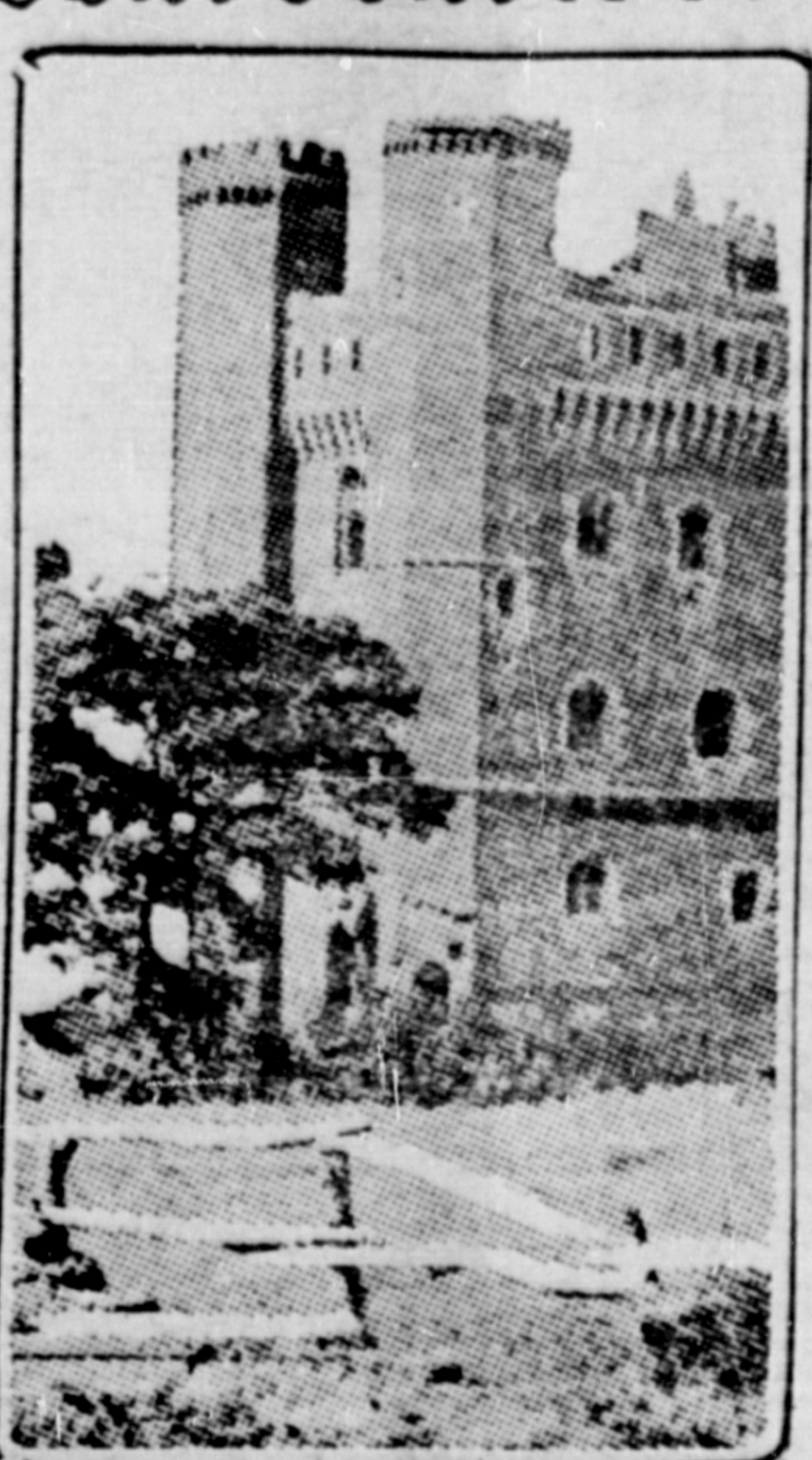

Importing an English Castle



Worst of all, he is going to take it to America and erect it again there, stone by stone, just as it appeared when the folk of the Fen country built it, more than four hundred years ago. All England has risen in protest against this so-called outrage; in some cases it is even classed as a sacrilege. Yet the people who are protesting have but themselves to blame in the matter. For some years a movement was on foot to preserve this old castle for the public, and its impoverished owners offered it for this purpose at a far less price than the American paid for it.

Public subscriptions were solicited and state aid applied for, but it seemed impossible to awaken any interest in the matter. Now this apathy has flared up into indignant protest. Yet the peering of Great Britain has for years been disposing of its heirlooms in the shape of works of art to American collectors and nothing said or thought of it. Perhaps this episode may lead the British Government to think the example of other European governments, which have stringent regulations against the removal of historic art works from the country, one worthy of emulation.
