## RECOGNIZE CONQUEST

Sovereignty of Italy Over Ethiopia Now Admitted by Canada

OTTAWA, Dec. 23: (CP)-Forma recognition by Canada of Italy's conquest of Ethiopia was announced last night by Premier William Lyon Mackenzie King. The Dominion addresses King Victor Emmanuel as "Emperor of Ethiopia." The British ambassador to Rome has been requested to so notify Italy.
