Waterfront Whiffs

Smokehouse to be Installed at Fisheries Experimental Station Here—Louise to Replace Adelaide—A Fisherman's Experience in the Agricultural Hinterland

To carry on a new type of practical experimental work designed to help the industry, another installation is to be made at the Prince Rupert Fisheries Experimental Station in the form of a 500-pound fish smokehouse, it is announced by the director, Dr. Neal Carter. The smokehouse will be installed in the basement of the First Avenue and McBride Street building and will be built from plans designed at the Halifax Fisheries Experimental Station. Peter Sunderland will be in charge of this particular branch of the station's work.

C. P. R. steamer Princess Louise will be coming north next week on the Vancouver-Ocean Falls-Prince Rupert run in place of the Princess Adelaide which is to be withdrawn for three weeks for annual overhaul at Victoria. Capt. S. K. Gray and other officers of the Princess Adelaide will transfer to the Louise with the exception of Purser Arthur Graves who will be off next week and for whom Purser Peter Hole will relieve.

When Chris Fossum, a Prince Rupert fisherman of renown, landed at Francois Lake this winter it was the first time in his life he had ever been so far away from the salt chuck. As far as the agricultural areas of the hinterland was concerned, he might be said to have been green—so green, in fact, we hear, that it was hard to keep the cows from eating him up since, as everyone knows, the bovines like to eat almost anything that looks green. One day one of the young Francois Lake farmers was to take a couple of loads of hay to a tie camp about six miles distant.
