



week's landings at Prince Rupert _ aggregated only 202,600 pounds of which 114,000 pounds was from 18 SYNOD IS Canadian vessels and 88,500 pounds from eight American boats. This brought the season's landings to date up to a total of 2,431,100 pounds as compared with 3,427,000 pounds at a corresponding date last year, the Canadian total being 1,-288,900 pounds as against 1,893,800 pounds a year ago while the American aggregate was 1,142,200 pounds as compared with 1,533,200 pounds. The top price of the week for Canadian fish was 13.9c and 4c paid the Jennie Bay for 4,500 pounds and the low 6c and 4c received by the R.W. for 9,000 pounds. For American fish the high price of the week was 14.5c and 5c paid synod of the diocese of Caledonia the Chum for 8,500 pounds and the low 9.4c and 5c which the Yukon received for 25,000 pounds.




