According to reports of packers today, salmon trolling has been anything but good around Dundas and Stephens Islands of late. Weather has been fair but the run of fish has been disappointing. Reports from North Island grounds are somewhat better.

C. P. R. steamer Princess Adelaide, Capt. Henry Anderson, is due in port at 3:45 this afternoon from the south and will sail at 10 p.m. on her return to Vancouver and waypoints. The vessel is bringing in a number of passengers who will proceed east by the evening train.

Halibut landings at Seattle yesterday totaled 123,000 pounds from six boats as follows: Eagle, 40,000 pounds, San Juan, 7½c and 7½c; Tacoma, 18,000, New England, 6½c and 6c; Thelma II, 15,500, Booth, 7½c and 6c; Rosario, 14,000, McCallum, 6½c and 6c; Argo, 18,000, Sebastian, 7½c and 6c; Aloha, 18,000, Whiz, 7c and 6c. Ling cod was sold for 4c per pound and sablefish for 5c.

The halibut boat Charmine C. has landed at Vancouver a halibut which she caught in Hecate Straits bearing the brand "Hoover." The fish is believed to have been one that was released after having been marked by the American boat Hoover.
