Since Soviet women are prevented by law from avoiding childbirth factories, mines, mills and collective farms must provide for the maternity period. Care of the expect-, ant mothers figures largely in the Soviet industrial plans. The maternity vacation begins two months before birth and ends two months after. In the Stalin automobile plant, 2,384 women became mothers in 1937.

Hospitals, nurseries and kindergartens are provided by the mothers' employers, which is the government. There are 20,300 nurseries and 4,175 mother and child welfare centres. Nursing mothers work only six hours a day, taking time out every three hours to nurse Edward Pongs of Massett, who their babies.
