## Anemone Farms Important Industry

LONDON, Dec. 14—A chance experiment made fourteen years ago has brought a new and profitable industry to Cornwall and extended its cut flower season from three to six months. Travelling in France in 1924, a Cornish resident was so impressed with the beauty of the giant anemone which grew in abundance even during the winter months that he brought back some of the seed of the variety Du Caen and planted them in his garden in the West Country. They flowered just as profusely in the warm soil and mild Cornish climate as on the Continent. Growers noted this fact and soon bunches were on their way to Covent Garden, London's central flower market, where they proved popular owing to the excellent way they last. The demand increased and increased and so began the new Cornish industry of anemone growing.

Today anemone farms cluster around Penzance and in the sheltered spots along the Devon and Cornish coast. In Cornwall alone there are over 1,000 growers while the acreage under cultivation has increased from 50 to 400 in the last seven years. This year the anemone traffic promises to break all records. In the early hours of one morning, at the end of last month over six tons, representing 600,000 blooms, arrived at Paddington Station, London, en route for Covent Garden alone—a 40 per cent. increase over the traffic received in a similar night last year.

A chap was charged with fighting in the street and was brought before the judge.


Judge: "What is your name, occupation and what are you charged with?"


