The President neatly proposed "Kindred Societies" and Frank Ellis, replying for the Sons of England, which had been specially mentioned, gave a clever humorous poem of his own which is quoted in full elsewhere. Replies on behalf of other societies represented were received with applause. The toast of "The

Press," proposed with good humored threats of demolition by Alderman Clayton, was well responded to by Mayor Newton. With a wee deugh an' dhoris, and "Auld Lang Syne," the gathering broke up in good order at 3:30 a. m., well satisfied with the third celebration of the bard's birthnight in Rupert.
