Wells Gray, minister of lands. This was more than in any year since 1929 although still half a million dollars less than the record year of 1928.

Capt. Howard Giske, well known Seattle halibut boat operator, has taken over his new boat Kingfisher which has just been completed by Edward E. Johnson, veteran Tacoma boatbuilder. Capt. Giske formerly operated the Neptune which is now engaged in freighting in southeastern Alaska. The Kingfisher is 57 feet long, 18 feet beam and 5 1/2 feet deep with 75 h.p. Atlas Imperial diesel engine.

On her first tourist voyage of the season, C.N.R. steamer Prince George, Capt. Edward Mabbs, arrived in port at 9:30 this morning from Vancouver, Powell River and Ocean Falls and sailed at 1 o'clock this afternoon for Skagway and other northern points. Leaving Vancouver, the Prince George had a capacity list of 213 passengers of whom 121 are round trip tourists. There were a few for Powell River and Ocean Falls while twenty or so disembarked here.

'SNOW WHITE' COMES HERE

Walt Disney Full-Length Animated Feature is Vivid Picturization of Grimms' Fairy Fantasy

King Will Lead Home Fleet Out

His Majesty Will Spend Three Days With His Ships in Manoeuvres

PORTSMOUTH, England, June 15: (CP)—King George has set aside three days in June to visit the Home Fleet. His schedule includes participation in manoeuvres, attendance at a ship's concert and a visit to shore establishments.

Arriving by train at Weymouth next Monday, he will be received by Admiral Sir Charles Forbes, commander-in-chief of the Home Fleet and other flag officers and go aboard the royal yacht Victoria and Albert.

The following day the King will lead the fleet to sea in H.M.S. Nelson, the flagship, and will watch various exercises and manoeuvres, including the catapulting of aircraft, torpedo attacks by destroyer flotillas, firing practice at the Centurion by battle ships and cruisers and live bombing practice by aircraft.

The fleet will return to Weymouth Bay the same day and in the evening the King will attend a fleet concert on H.M.S. Courageous, whose enormous hangar will be transformed into a theatre. Officers and lower-deck ratings will provide a program of the old-fashioned music hall type, similar to that which the Duke of Windsor saw at Portland in 1936 as King Edward VIII.

On the third day the King will land at Portland and visit the anti-submarine school and other shore establishments and return to London in the afternoon.
