### CORRUPTION IN HIGH PLACES?

One of the most flagrant cases of what looks like corruption in high places is seen in Europe today where following a supposed judicial decision of an arbitration board consisting of the Italian and German foreign ministers, the beneficiaries of the judgment handing over a large slice of Czechoslovakia to Hungary promise to repay the judges for the decision they made. It indicates a low standard of political morality in Hungary. It is hoped that the arbitrators will disclaim being influenced by any promises and will refuse absolutely to receive any reward. If they did their duty, no reward is coming to them. If they gave Hungary more than was coming to her, they are open to censure.

### RIGHT TO SPEAK OUT

In our political set-up Liberals, while belonging to and supporting the party, reserve to themselves the right to speak out in connection with matters that concern their constituents. That is where they seem to differ from other parties. To oppose a C.C.F. policy is to break with the party as seen in the case of the late lamented leader of that party. As a general rule, Conservatives follow the leaders faithfully without any discordant note of independence. It is part of the Liberal constitution that members have the right of expression, no matter whether it is opposed to the party policy or not as long as they do not vote to try to upset the government.

The member for Skeena has expressed himself very forcibly in regard to the need of completion of the highway between Terrace and Hazelton. We are glad he is after that project. Our idea is that the whole highway should be completed under a three-year contract, the Legislature providing for the work to be completed from Prince Rupert to Hazelton on or before the end of the year 1941 and that the first hundred miles go by a route north of the Skeena River. It will never be done unless a big contract is let. The work should be done in a modern manner with modern machinery. As it is now it is a little relief project, not a highway project.

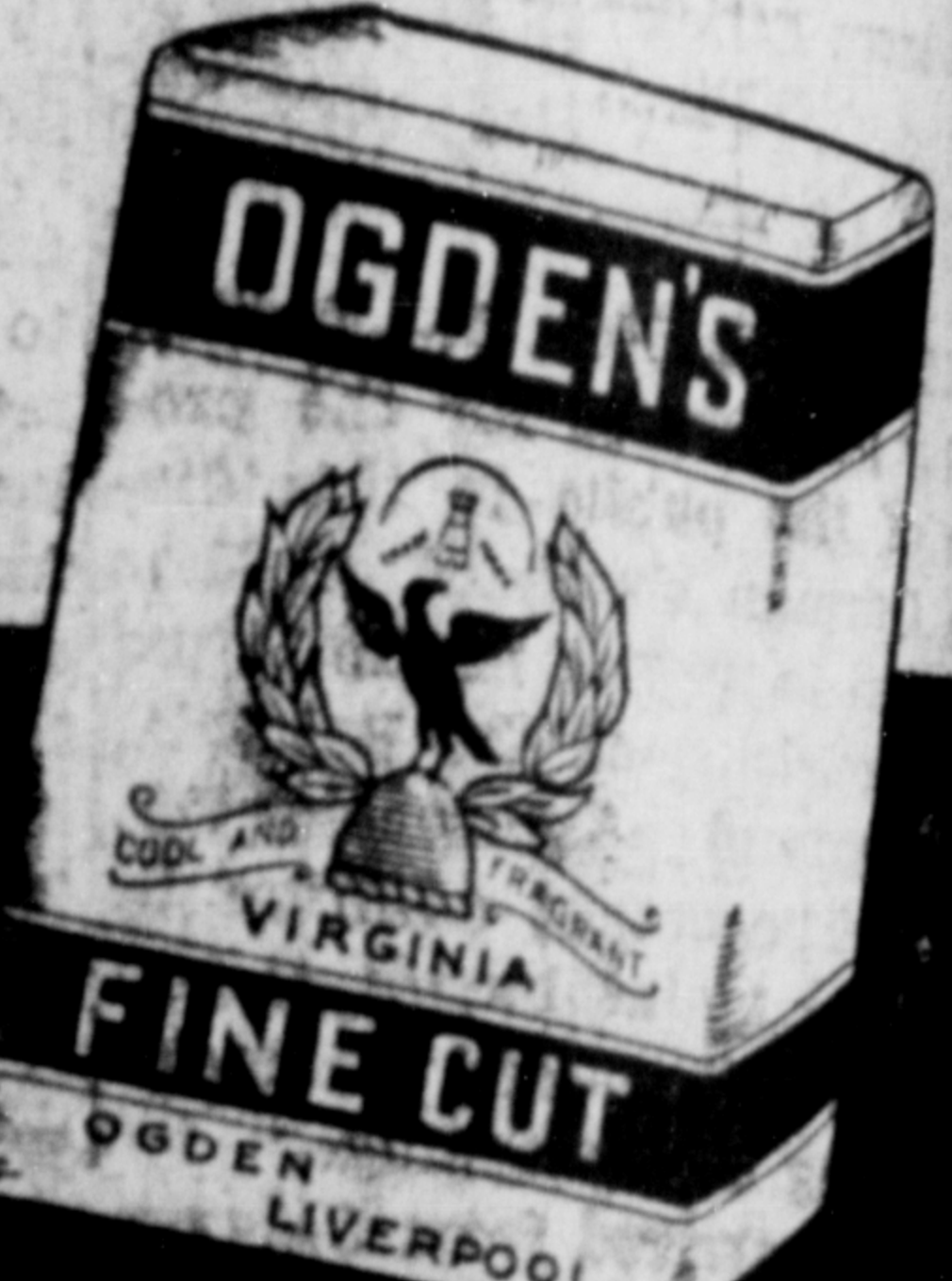
