Indians Drop Into Tie With Second Place New York Yankees In American League

BOSTON, May 10: (CP)- For the first time this season, the Cleveland Indians are not in exclusive possession of first place in the American League. The Boston Red Sox pounded them for a 15 to 3 defeat yesterday, it being the Red Sox fourth straight victory. The Indians, as a result, slipped into a tie with the second place New York Yankees whose game with Chicago White Sox at Yankee Stadium was rained out. The slugging of the Red Sox included home runs by Jimmy Foxx in the sixty and seventh innings and a circuit clout by Jce Cronin in the fifth.

The 7 to 1 victory of the Washington Senators over the St. Louis Browns was the Senators' sixth straight win and the seventh straight loss of the Browns. The Senators are now but half a game from the league leadership with the Red Sox, in turn, only half a game behind them.

Boston Bees took a ten-inning 7 to 5 victory over Pittsburg Pirates in the National League to move into sixth place ahead of the Brookyn Dodgers who were losing 9 to 7 to the St. Louis Cardinals.
