

"It seems that a good deal of light reading which is sold everywhere else in the world will be unobtainable in South Africa," a leading Cape Town bookseller said in an interview.

As well as the formidable list al ready compiled, the minister has empowered the censor board to stop many other periodicals entering the Union. It is stated that in many cases it is not the written matter that is responsible for the action taken but the advertisements and cover illustrations.
