CITY FINANCES ARE DISPUTED

Retiring Mayor of Everett and New Mayor Differ as to Cash in Hand—Does the Story "Knock" the Town?

(Canadian Press Despatch.) Everett, Jan. 27.—R. H. Hartley, whose term as mayor expired the first of the year, maintains that when he stepped from office he turned over to his successor \$17,806 after all bills for the year had been paid.

Mayor R. B. Hassell makes a financial statement in which he explains that the outgoing administration left exactly \$229.25 that could be used for the maintenance of administrative departments. He does not intend to imply that the remainder of the cash mentioned by Mr. Hartley is not on hand, but the two take issue regarding legal authority for utilizing the money.

Mr. Hartley is positive that the \$17,806.59 comes under the head of general funds and may be expended for any purpose that represents an emergency.
