NOTHING BUT NEWS BULLETINS IN WINNIPEG

Wills Shipping 150 Tons of Paper But Not Enough for Demand.

(Special via G. T. P. Telegraphs.)
WINNIPEG, January 19.—The papers still discontinue to publish owing to shortage of newsprint. A bulletin of a few hundred words printed on a flatbed press for distribution to the clubs and shops and to paste on billboards and various other places, is all the news Winnipeggers are getting.
Word from Fort Francis says that the paper company has agreed to sell its quota of fifteen per cent. to Canadian papers and that about 150 tons, which would bring the company up to date would be dispatched by freight. The supply of the larger quantity to keep the newspapers going has not been settled.

RESTRAIN POLAND FIGHTING RUSSIA

Clash Between Polish and German Troops Near Argonau.

LONDON, Jan. 19.—Marshal Foch and Sir Henry Wilson of the Inter-Allied Military Council, consulted today and yesterday on restraining Poland from military operations against Russia.
According to an official dispatch from Berlin there has been a clash between Polish and German troops near Argonau.

BOLSHEVIKI FORCES REPORTED DEFEATED

Said to be Now in Demoralized Retreat on Lithuanian and Ruthenian Front.

WARSAW, Jan. 19.—Bolshevik forces on the Lithuanian and Ruthenian front have been defeated and are reported to be in a demoralized retreat.
